

\$57,430 IN GRANTS AWARDED BY CAYA

CAYA raises money to help fund community programs throughout Culpeper, Rappahannock and Fauquier counties. CAYA awarded grants to the following organizations between November 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021.

\$10,000 Verdun Adventure Bound for the purchase of a new bus

The 15-person passenger bus allows Verdun to provide transportation to campers and program participants. The Verdun bus serves youth and adults in need of services.

\$5,000 Northern Piedmont Community Foundation Sallie Morgan Scholarship

Fills a gap for individuals wishing to pursue a degree in the mental health field.

\$5,000 Sex, Drugs, & God Community Care Partner Step-Work Scholarship Program

Providing peer coaching, mentoring, support, and financial aid to individuals struggling with addiction.

\$3,200 Mental Health Association to support the training of an instructor for the Teen Mental Health First Aid Program

The effect that this pandemic is having among our youth has impacted their emotional well-being. Equipping them with coping skills can help them in the years to come and even save a life.

\$3,000 RRCS Mind-Body Workbooks for Addiction & Sessions By the Sea AA Conference

The mind-body workbook for addiction is certified as an evidenced-based method to help people in recovery become more aware of their negative thoughts and teaches them how to regulate strong emotions such as anxiety, anger, worry and stress—all emotions that lie at the core of addiction issues. CAYA sent five people in recovery to the Sessions By the Sea AA Conference. This was an opportunity for individuals in early recovery to interact with others of all ages and backgrounds who are in both early and long-term recovery.

\$1,000 EACH to Culpeper, Fauquier, Eastern View, and Liberty high schools

For end-of-year celebrations to combat the negative effects the pandemic had on students from isolation with virtual learning.

\$1,000 Team Jordan suicide and drug prevention efforts

\$500 OR LESS TO EACH of the following CARS, Verdun Adventure Bound programming, and Oxford House of Cottonwood.

2021 CAYA Coalition Substance Abuse Prevention Grant

The COVID pandemic really hit the substance abuse program community. We know that many 12-step and support group meetings were impacted heavily and so were other worthy efforts to help people with substance abuse disorders. CAYA saw a reduction in the number of grant requests made to us. We hope that by opening a grant cycle, we can help new efforts that we just don't know about. Substance Abuse Prevention Grant awarded \$2,500 to each of the following groups:

Sex, Drugs, & God, Inc. to offer financial aid to individuals struggling with addiction who are working on their recovery so they can re-enter society as a contributing member of the community.

SpiritWorks Foundation to help expand the Apprentice Program that serves to train a generation of individuals in recovery to contribute to the workforce as productive citizens.

Spiritual Care Support Ministries, Inc. to purchase a training module, "Breaking Free" and fund support materials/notebooks for 20 counselors who provide one-on-one counseling to individuals suffering from an addiction disorder.

CARS Christ-Centered Addiction Restoration Services to purchase program materials for the 2022–2023 year for weekly support groups.


Charitable Giving

ORGANIZATION HISTORY

Launched in 2016, Come As You Are was formed by Moira Satre in response to the sudden and tragic death of her son, Bobby, from a drug overdose on April 18, 2015. Moira felt she navigated the merciless waters of drug addiction alone, without a life raft. Information on the internet was overwhelming and local resources were lacking. The loss of her son was traumatic enough, but feeling alone and hopeless throughout his addiction worsened her circumstances. Moira wanted to carry her son's memory in a positive way and created an organization aimed to help those in similar situations without judgement. Come As You Are was born.
